PUBLIC HEARING

April 22 2019

A Public Hearing of the Mayor and Town Council of Snow Hill, Maryland was held at the Train Station at 200 Belt Street on Monday, April 22 2019 with Mayor Stephen Mathews presiding and was called to order at 6:30pm.

Mayor Mathews opened the Public Hearing at 6:30pm. He advised that this hearing is for the de-annexation of the property known as Summerfield. He added the details are spelled out in the Resolution on de-annexing the property that was annexed years ago.

Kevin Karpinski explained the process of Charter Amendment's. Letters were sent to the property owners advising of the intent to de-annex the property. The Charter Amendment will change the meets and bounds of the town, therefore, removing the annexed land. The public hearing was advertised on line and in the local newspaper. If the Charter Amendment is approved, a copy will be posted at Town Hall for 40 days and a summery will be published in the newspaper during this time four times in weekly intervals. If a petition to referendum is not submitted during the 40 days, the Resolution becomes effective on the 50th day. The petition to referendum must have a minimum of 20% of the registered voters.

The Resolution will be presented at the May 14, 2019 town meeting.

The were no questions or comments from the Council or the audience.

With no requested speakers, Mayor Mathews closed the hearing at 6:38pm.
